Section 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation

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Extinguishing Media

Special Hazards Arising from the Chemical

Flammable liquid and vapor. Product may be sensitive to static discharge, which could result in fire or explosion. Vapors may form explosive mixture with air. Vapors are heavier than air and may travel along the ground to some distant source of ignition and flash back. Empty product containers may retain product residue and can be dangerous. Containers may rupture or explode.

Hazardous Combustion Products

Decomposition and combustion materials may be toxic. Burning may produce carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, formaldehyde.

Fire Fighting Measures

Keep storage containers cool with water spray. Move container from fire area if it can be done without risk.
